Course Requirements

- Three 3-page papers

All work must be completed to receive a passing final grade.

Participation

10 possible bonus points. Class participation can only bring grades *up*, never down Bonus points kick in at the half-grade margin (e.g. between a C+ and B-)

Papers

Topics will be assigned in class approximately one week in advance. Due dates subject to revision. Papers are to be turned in through Canvas.

Extensions will be granted when circumstances warrant provided arrangements are made with the instructor at least 24 hours in advance. There are no automatic extensions. It is better to ask for an extension sooner rather than later. Except in unusual circumstances (e.g. medical emergencies, a disaster that strikes the student or the immediate family), *unexcused* late papers are subject to being dropped at least one letter grade e.g. B>C.

Interpretations or ideas borrowed, directly or indirectly, from secondary sources or other people (apart from the instructor but including fellow students) must be footnoted. All use of web-based material must be footnoted. Anything else is plagiarism and will be treated as such. Students are encouraged to discuss paper topics with others in the class but must write the papers alone. Any use of Al to complete an assignment unless otherwise permitted by me is "considered use of an unauthorized aid according to the Extended Studies Academic Integrity Policy" and a violation of academic integrity.
